<u>SWACHHATA ABHIYANA REPORT – UNIT 1 – GANDHINAGAR SLUM</u>

Swachhata Abhiyana was conducted in adopted area of Gandhinagar Slum in Kolar town on August 30th 2016 with the sole intention of Swachhata and increasing awareness in the population of Gandhinagar slum regarding ill effects of open air defecation. Ground work was done by PRO Mamatha who worked at a PHC run by Sri Devaraj Urs Medical College by Dept of Community Medicine under the guidance of Dr. B.G.Ranganath. As the population in Gandhinagar is very large it was decided that the outreach activity will be done in Govt primary school in Gandhinagar area. A total of 80 children studying in the school of gandhinagar area.

The programme began with the rally by NSS volunteers. The volunteers raised slogans on Swachhta and mainly concentrated on stopping open air defecation. Then they reached the school, volunteers cleaned the school premises along with school students of Govt. primary school Gandhinagar. Swachhata Abhiyana was conducted by NSS Unit 2 in their earmarked adopted village Doddiganehalli on August 29th 2016 with the intention of getting to know the community, understanding their problems and need which would in turn help us in planning future activities that would benefit the community living in that village. Ground work was done by Community Medicine department PRO and Health inspector Mr. Shankar Reddy who at ground level met the Anganwadi teacher of that village and found out the problems and need in that area and a list of people from that village who belonged to the backward caste and low socioeconomic status. A list of 96 families was shortlisted which included majority of the population of Doddiganehalli as most of them had very low socioeconomic status.

Today on 29th August 2016 the NSS unit-II decided to the Swachhata abhiyan programme at Govt. Primary school Doddiganahalli with the help of Mr. Shankar Reddy, Health Inspector, DRS, ANM, Interns and NSS volunteers of Unit II.

The NSS Unit II first cleaned the entire premises of Govt. Primary school Doddiganahalli. Dr. Jayakumar J K, NSS Programme Officer, Unit II, gave a talk on Swachhata and its relationship with the health to students of Govt. Primary school.
