

KCIAPM Zonal Level Undergraduate Pathology Quiz – 2025

The Department of Pathology, Sri Devaraj Urs Medical College, Tamaka, Kolar, hosted the *KCIAPM Zonal Level Undergraduate Pathology Quiz – 2025* on **16th September 2025**. The event was organized under the leadership of **Dr. T. N. Suresh**, Professor and Head of Pathology, who served as Organising Chairperson. **Dr. Hemalatha A**, Professor, and **Dr. Sudarshan K**, Assistant Professor, acted as Co-organising Secretaries. The quiz was conducted online via the Zoom platform, with participants assembled at the University Library, B.C. Roy AV Hall.

A total of **nine medical colleges** from across Mysore and Mangalore zones participated: KVG Medical College (Sullia), Adichunchanagiri Institute of Medical Sciences (B.G. Nagara), Chamarajanagar Institute of Medical Sciences, Mandya Institute of Medical Sciences, K.S. Hegde Medical Academy (Mangaluru), Father Muller Medical College (Mangaluru), Mysore Medical College (Mysuru), Kasturba Medical College (Mangaluru), and JSS Medical College (Mysuru).

The competition began with an **elimination round** conducted on the Kahoot platform. Five teams—Kasturba Medical College (Mangaluru), Mysore Medical College (Mysuru), Mandya Institute of Medical Sciences, K.S. Hegde Medical Academy (Mangaluru), and Father Muller Medical College (Mangaluru)—advanced to the finals.

The **final quiz** comprised six innovative rounds: *Straight to the Point* (general pathology and scientists), *Specimen Safari* (gross specimens), *Micro Mysteries* (microscopic features), *Case Chronicles* (clinical-pathological correlation), *Pathotoons* (cartoon-based pathology), and *Whirlwind of Pathology* (rapid-fire Kahoot round).

After a closely contested final, **Mysore Medical College, Mysuru**, emerged as the **winners**. The event concluded with a **valedictory ceremony**, where Dr. Hemalatha A delivered the vote of thanks.

The quiz provided a stimulating academic platform, fostering knowledge, teamwork, and enthusiasm among undergraduates, while strengthening academic collaboration across medical colleges in the region.
